Oakville hosts 2nd annual reunion

On Saturday, the 14th of October 2023 60 Habibians and their spouses gathered at the River Oaks Community Center in the City of Oakville south-west of Toronto in the Greater Toronto Area. This was the 2nd annual reunion, with spouses, of the Canadian Chapter, the first having taken place on the 5th of November 2022 with an identical number participating.

Setting off to a rollicking start

The ball was set in motion on the 25th of June, 2022 with Sir Mohammad Anas announcing the formation of the HPSAA Canada Chapter at the Masjid in Vaughan, with 14 Habibians participating. Thereafter, on the 20th of July, 2022 10 Habibians met at the Karhai Point in Oakville to meet visiting Habibian Aftab Iqbal. This was followed by the 1st annual reunion on 5th November with 60 Habibians in attendance, and on the 26th of December 2022 14 Habibians got together for Nihari at the Tabaq restaurant in Mississauga. Midway through 2023, on the 3rd of June, 19 Habibians met for Dinner at the Karachi Highway Karhai in Mississauga.

"Before we started the Canadian chapter last year I could barely count three alumni in Canada. Now I have almost 90 alumni in my list, and I am sure there are many more that we have yet to reach out to," said Syed Hamid Hussain, the Chairman of the HPSAA Canadian Chapter, speaking to me via WhatsApp at 3am PST from half a world away.

Personal touch for old friends

For the 2nd annual reunion the hall was booked between 6pm to 10pm, with 6 to 7.30pm earmarked for the setup of the tables, chairs, buffet table layout, and aesthetic design for the occasion. "We spread the table linen ourselves and my wife took in hand the interior décor."

"A fair bit of effort went into holding the dinner involving disposable crockery, cutlery and cups, the serving of food and making of tea. We had two helpers assigned by the caterers Shaheen Enterprises, who cooked and delivered the food, with the helpers serving and replenishing the buffet table, and also helped in winding up at the end and making take away boxes and washing some dishes."

Austerity and zero waste

In the weeks preceding Syed Hamid Hussain was on the lookout for discount sales for cold drinks, and other things to "get the most bang for the buck" as he put it. He didn't manage to find any volunteers to help at the occasion, except for Syed Ameer Mehdi (Batch of 1987) who came onboard early, and to whom he offers many thanks.

Cashew nuts and mixed nuts were also served in bowls before dinner. Exhibiting great attention to detail, Syed Hamid Hussain had bought plastic Cosco boxes for takeaway of leftover food, ensuring nothing went to waste. "Attendees took food home, including ice cream! Everyone was overjoyed for the extra food in their fridge considering people in Canada have to do their own cooking, and the gesture was greatly appreciated by all."

Fateha for the dear departed

Syed Hamid Hussain made the only speech of the evening. "We offered Fatcha for our departed teachers, schoolmates, family members and those martyred in Palestine. We also prayed for the health and happiness of ourselves and our families.

Mr. Fazil Bharucha (Vice President, HPSAA) attended the event. He got so caught up in meeting old friends that he missed making his speech that contained a message from the President HPSAA, Mr. Saeed Allawala, which is reproduced below.

The old batch mates had made small groups of 4 to 5 and were busy reminiscing the good old days along with interacting with the senior batches to exchange notes with how life had changed at the HPS over time. Networking was a major value addition of the dinner, and a primary reason for organizing the Canadian chapter of the HPSAA. Knowing who is who and who is where is all important in finding better jobs in Canada. "Then there is the pressing need to get the kids married into families that have something in common with each other. This is an area on which we are working further."

Dinner Dynamics

Earlier this year Syed Hamid Hussain had collected about C\$2500 for registering the HPSAA Canadian Chapter at C\$40 per head. This dinner was C\$45 per head, and the amount was adjusted for those who had paid earlier, and the balance money he is reimbursing to those who had paid and could not attend.

"For the most part the dinner was a replay of our dinner last year, but this year we introduced party games with 2 games for the gents, 2 for the ladies, and 1 for couples. Everyone participated with great enthusiasm and the winners were given gift cards worth C\$25 for Tim Horton Coffee. Abu Omar Khaldi (Batch of 1971) sang a few songs minus the music, as also did a few others present, with everyone immensely enjoying their performance. Next year we hope to plan something different, like a picnic in the park, or a proper musical program."

The Dinner wrapped up at 10pm and not because people wanted to leave, but because that was the agreed to end time with the venue's management and the cleaning crew turned up! "The hall was packed and nobody wanted to leave. By the time we wrapped up it was 10.45pm in any case. Everyone went home very happy."


