
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Inaugural HPSAA Healthcare Seminar



Shabbar Zaidi's Roadmap for Pakistan's Economic Revival

 Renowned economist and former FBR chairman Shabbar Zaidi has proposed a simple formula to revive Pakistan's economy without external investment. Speaking at the Habibian Dialogue organized by Habib Public School Alumni Association, he emphasized upholding human rights, integrating youth into the national mainstream, prioritizing health and education, and focusing on exports and skilled manpower. Zaidi warned that without a conducive environment. professionals will continue to leave the country, and called for reforms in governance, business hours, and urban culture.

1. Kindly let us know your batch year, and house colour.

As a proud member of the 1976 graduating class, I spent my formative years in Green House after joining Habib Public School in 1967. My nine-year journey at this esteemed institution laid the foundation for my personal and professional development.

2. Let us know what keeps you busy these days and if you have any hobbies.

While I am currently engaged in entrepreneurial ventures on a modest scale, my true focus lies in driving social impact initiatives worldwide. This work is not just a commitment but a profound passion—one that brings me immense fulfillment.

Beyond this, I find joy and relaxation in cooking, a creative outlet that also happens to keep my wife delighted. It's a simple pleasure that balances my professional endeavors with personal contentment.

3. Share fond memory of your school years.

One of my most cherished memories dates back to 1967—even before I was formally admitted to school. I vividly recall sitting quietly on a chair by the wall as my parents spoke with the principal, Mr. Hassan Akhtar, across his desk. While the adults conversed, I observed, unaware of the profound lesson unfolding. At one point, my father asked if I could be sent for the entrance test to save time. Mr. Akhtar's response has stayed with me ever since: "The test is already in progress. What matters is not the student's intelligence—that's for the school to nurture—but whether they come from a principled family and will positively influence their peers." This moment shaped my outlook profoundly. It taught me that integrity and character are foundational; skills can be honed, but a person's inherent goodness is irreplaceable. No amount of effort can reform someone devoid of it—a guiding principle in my life and decisions since.

4. How did the teachers and environment at the HPS help you in your personal growth.

I consider myself incredibly fortunate to have been taught by educators who went beyond academics

— they instilled in us strong values, integrity, and the principles of being good human beings. That, I believe, is the greatest gift one can ever receive. My nine years at HPS laid a robust foundation for my character, shaping not only who I am today but also the trajectory of my professional and personal growth. The lessons in discipline, empathy, and perseverance that I learned there continue to guide me, underscoring the profound influence of an education that nurtures both the mind and the soul.

5. What inspired you to take on the role of the leader for the HPSAA Chapter in the country of your residence?

While my initial involvement in this role began through nomination rather than personal pursuit, I've grown to deeply value this responsibility. Our respected teacher, Mr. Mohammad Anas, honored me with this position alongside two distinguished peers: Mustafa Master (1972 batch) and my classmate Asad Asghar, who remains a close friend to this day.

What began as an appointed duty has become a genuine pleasure. This position allows me to maintain meaningful connections among our community of 70+ Habibian alumni, preserving the bonds that make

our network so valuable. The opportunity to facilitate these enduring relationships has proven to be one of my most rewarding endeavors.

I'm grateful for the chance to serve our alumni community in this capacity.

6. What role can the alumni residing in Canada in supporting not only the students who are currently enrolled at the HPS but help the HPSAA in securing scholarships to the deserving underprivileged HPS students for their higher studies in Pakistan universities?

To ensure the integrity of this initiative, the parent HPSSA in Karachi will needs to take the responsibility of overseeing the candidate selection process and verify eligibility.
